BASICS OF COSMETOLOGY (Practical)

COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

1. Identify skin types (Normal, Oily, Dry, Combination)and demonstrate appropriate basic care.
2. Perform practical procedures for common skin problems (Acne, Pigmentation) and daily skin routine (Cleansing, Toning, Moisturizing, Face pack).
3. Demonstrate hair-care techniques : hair wash, conditioning, oil massage and basic treatments for Hair Fall, Dandruff and Split Ends.
4. Prepare simple herbal /home-made products for skin,hair and nails and apply patch-test safety.
5. Execute basic hair cutting (U-cut,Straight cut),simple hair styles(Braid, Bun, Curls)and operate styling tools (Blow dryer, Straightener, Curler).
6. Perform nail care and simple nail art; clean, sanitize and maintain tools and equipment.

PRACTICALS:

1. SKIN CARE AND TREATMENT

- Identification of skin types: Normal, Oily, Dry and Combination skin, and their care.
- Treatment of skin problems : Practical treatment of Acne and Pigmentation.
- Skin routine: Method of Cleansing, Toning and Moisturizing (CTM) and application of face pack.

2. HAIR CARE AND TREATMENT

- Practical treatment of hair problems: Hair Fall, Dandruff and Split Ends.
- Hair care procedures: Hair wash, Conditioning and Oil massage.

3. DIY HERBAL PRODUCTS (SKIN, HAIR, NAIL)

- Preparation of home-made/herbal products for skin, hair and nails.
- Correct use of herbal products for skin, hair and nail care.

4. HAIR CUT AND HAIR STYLE

- Use of hair styling tools: Blow Dryer, Straightener and Curler.
- Hair cutting: Basic U-cut and Straight cut.
- Simple hair styles: Making Braid, Bun and Curls.
- Nail care and nail art: Nail care and decorative nail art.
- Sanitization and maintenance: Cleaning and sanitization of tools and equipment.

COURSE OUTCOMES

1. Correctly identify skin types and demonstrate an appropriate CTM routine and face- pack application.
2. Perform basic practical treatments for Acne, Pigmentation ,HairFall, Dandruff and Split Ends.
3. Prepare simple herbal products for skin, hair and nails and perform patch tests safely.
4. Execute basic haircuts(U-cut, Straight cut),simple hair styles(Braid, Bun, Curls)and operate styling tools safely.
5. Perform fundamental nail care and simple nail-art designs.
6. Maintain sanitization and basic maintenance of salon tools and equipment.

- The course introduces basic hair styling and setting techniques.
- Learners get knowledge of tools and products used in hair dressing.
- It develops hygiene, safety, and professional salon habits.
